Approaches:

- Frame discussions around the ACEM Curriculum Framework domain descriptors which have been summarised in the table below
- Metacognition: understand how **you** prioritise information
 - Consider a recent complex case:
 - How did you decide what was relevant, important?
 - What information did you tell to whom?
- Discuss a case seen by the mentee and explore this domain together
- Offer to observe the mentee in a clinical setting and then discuss
